

COLLABORATION

To focus on our own learning we need calm classrooms. supportive leadership, trusting collegial relationships, encouragement and honest, open communication.

The best learning draws on the most insightful wisdom and quality evidence, avoiding reinventing the wheel and deepening your repertoire of what do to, how to do it and why it works.



When we collaborate, we are forced to articulate what we currently do and identify more clearly the discrepancy between what we want instead. We hold each other accountable for change and provide moral support.

LEADERSHIP

We all need space to reflect and a coach can facilitate clarity and confidence, helping us see the wood for the trees. Instructional coaches act likes sport coaches with regular observation, detailed corrective and supportive feedback.

Learning happens best when we understand concrete applications in specific topics for specific pupils and only later learn to generalise the rule, so avoid generic presentation of pedagogical ideas without time to apply and contextualise.

The only way that schools improve is when teachers improve. Wise and effective school leaders make the learning and support of their adult colleagues just as high a priority as the learning of the schools' sliquq.
